Lent is often a time for people to study in groups, a time for prayer, a time to give something up, a time for giving to support mission.

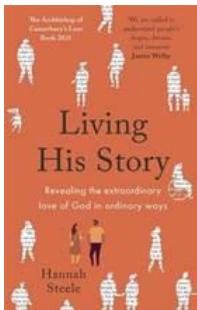
Ash Wednesday is the **17th February**
